## PROTECT NORTH SAANICH HEDGEROWS

The North Saanich Tree and Hedgerow Committee would like to remind all residents of the importance of the hedgerows which line our lanes, trails, beach accesses, agricultural lands and roadways. Hedgerows add to the aesthetic quality of our rural landscape, and also serve as noise, wind and privacy buffers; stability and erosion controls; natural fences; and habitats for birds and wildlife. Please help protect our hedgerows, both on your own property and on public lands. If you have questions about how you can help, please call the North Saanich Municipal Hall. If you have concerns about hedgerows that may contain invasive plants such as ivy and broom, contact the North Saanich Parks Department. They work hard to control invasive plants, whether in hedgerows or elsewhere in the District. There are many other beautiful and useful plants in our local hedgerows such as quince, honeysuckle, Saskatoonberry, huckleberry, Indian plum and a variety of fruit trees. Please respect our hedgerows as a necessary part of our environment. The Tree and Hedgerow Committee is reviewing the District's Tree Preservation Bylaw. ## DEVELOPMENT PROPOSAL - MILLS & WEST SAANICH ROADS

The R-2 (Single Family Residential 2) property at the corner of West Saanich and Mills Roads is currently under development. This property was subdivided into 18 lots back in 1920. The current owner proposes to amend the subdivision to reduce the number of lots to 15 single family residential lots. As a result of the development of this property, some preliminary excavation work will be done over the next few weeks. The owner is anxious to retain as many of the Garry oak trees located on these lots as possible. Two of the Garry oak trees were identified to be in poor health by a certified arborist. One tree was removed by BC Hydro for safety reasons and removal of the other is also recommended, with its trunk to remain as a "wildlife tree". One of the remaining Garry oaks is diseased with a fungus that often leads to blow-down from root rot. This tree will be monitored. Several of the remaining trees require crown cleaning, crown height reduction or deadwood removal to encourage healthy growth and to protect the flight path clearances. ## CONTROLLING INVASIVE PLANTS ON YOUR PROPERTY



Invasive plants are weedy, usually non-native plants that have been introduced outside their natural range. They are also known as invasives, escapees, noxious weeds and introduced, alien, and exotic plants. They thrive because of factors such as a lack of natural controls, and adaptations that enable them to spread and establish quickly. Impacts of these plants can be detrimental to humans, animals and entire ecosystems. Periwinkle, for example, can form an impenetrable layer on the Douglas-fir forest floor, making it impossible for native plants to grow. Scotch broom threatens rare Garry oak ecosystems, choking out the diversity of native plants. Although a number of invasive plants are well-established in North Saanich, it is possible to manage the spread of certain species. Residents can assist by controlling invasives on their properties.

## HERITAGE ADVISORY COMMISSION UPDATE

At a recent workshop on heritage preservation, members of the Heritage Advisory Commission (HAC) developed a vision for 2011. One of our strategies is to "identify, inventory and protect heritage assets while continuing to build community involvement." One of our community involvement initiatives was a gathering held in February which we called "Conversations with Our Past". Since its presentation, several people have asked us to publish the script. You can expect to see its publication, along with photographs and maps, by the fall or sooner.

On May 15<sup>th</sup> a small unveiling ceremony was held at Nymph Point Park. Two plaques now mark this significant site: one to commemorate the heritage designation made by our predecessors in 1982, and the second to acknowledge the point's First Nations' name, WSIIKEM, and its importance to Tseycum First Nation culture.

We continue to prepare an inventory of significant sites in North Saanich and in the fall a Strategic Plan will be produced which will set out a timetable and will include the development of a Community Heritage Register. This is an important part of the Commission's mandate, as are the public events which help us stay in touch with the people of North Saanich.

## NO OPEN AIR BURNING IN NORTH SAANICH



### AS OF MAY 14<sup>TH</sup>, 2006 THE DISTRICT OF NORTH SAANICH'S OPEN BURNING SEASON IS CLOSED.

The only burning that is permitted is burning in incinerators with a screen between sunrise and sunset on Thursdays and Fridays and from sunrise until 4:00 p.m. on Saturdays until further notice. The Dean Park area between Forest Park Drive and the municipal boundary west of East Saanich Road has a complete burning ban year round. Please consider alternatives to burning such as composting, recycling and chipping.

The burnables drop-off program at the Municipal Pit off Littlewood Road by the Legion had its last scheduled day of operation on Saturday, May 20<sup>th</sup>, 2006. A review of the pit operations and burning regulations is scheduled to take place at a meeting of the Municipal Council in the Council Chambers on **June 12<sup>th</sup>, 2006 at 7:00 p.m.** Members of the public are invited to attend the meeting. ## CHECK FIRST...TO SEE IF YOU NEED A BUILDING PERMIT

When planning any type of construction or renovation work on your home or property, it is important to check with the District's Building Department **BEFORE** you begin the work to determine if a building permit is required. Construction/renovation work on walkways, docks or wharfs on the waterfront are particularly sensitive matters, and it is important to ensure that all necessary permits or approvals are obtained **PRIOR** to any work being started. In most cases a simple phone call to the Building Department staff at 655-5470 can determine whether or not a permit is required. A handout entitled "Do I need a Building Permit?" is available at the Building Department counter and on the District's website to answer some of your questions.
